Instructions: 4 IN CROSS

Additional Instructions:

1. Any piece smaller than 1” in diameter should be re-sawn or sanded from a thicker timber.
2. The 4 IN CROSS can be completed as a normal inlay following the general directions, Start with plate 1 and work thru the plates in order to complete the inlay.
3. In addition you can complete as an inlaid inlay. To do this cut out your inlay pieces for plates 2 thru 4. Then set up your positioning plates on the material you wish to be the outside edge, which is thicker than your inlay pieces. In the display inlay we used Wenge’. Complete the inlay process using plates 2 thru 4. Now use plate 1, with the Collar removed from the inlay kit cut

deeper than the pieces previously inlaid. Using the bit provided with your inlay kit you can only cut $\frac{1}{4}$ in deep. (if you wish to go thicker an extended length bit is available on the website) Then resaw the entire inlay out. Use plate 1 with the collar on your inlay kit installed to inlay on your project.

4. Using the above method you can complete as an intarsia style inlay by just cutting your pocket shallower than your inlay. The top edges can be rounded by sanding or as in the display we used a dremel with a router base and a $\frac{1}{8}$ in roundover bit before resawing the inlay out.
