Additional Instructions: CLOWN FISH

However this particular design does require some additional instructions besides the basics available in the above mentioned video...

- 1. All parts for this inlay need to be cut in thicker material and re-sawn out, because of their small size.
- Clown Fish is an "Inlayed-Inlay". This means that you begin your inlay process on a piece of wood that will be the body of the design. In the display it is Padouk, or the orange portion of the body.
- 3. For clarity, directions are to recreate with the same woods as the display. However you can use any type of wood that you like. The thing that makes every inlay special is finding the perfect color or wood grain to accentuate the design.

Step #1

Cut your inlay pieces. Be sure that the collar is removed from your 1/8 In. inlay kit.

Wenge'- All parts marked #1 and the eye marked #4 these parts are for the tips of the fins and the eye.

Maple-All parts marked #2 these parts are for the three vertical stripes across the body.

Padouk-All parts marked #4 and #5 except the eye and mouth. These parts are for the Side fin, and lower fins.

Rose Heart-The mouth marked #4.

All parts to be re-sawn to 3/16 thick.

Step#2

Set up your positioning plates on a piece of padouk using plate #3 to find the grain or color that you want for the body. Remove plate#3 and using all plates marked #1 Cut pockets1/8 In. deep. Glue in your inlay pieces, let dry and sand flush. Be sure to install the collar on the inlay kit when cutting pockets.

Step#3

Cut pockets marked #2 1/8 In. deep. Glue in your inlay pieces. Let dry and sand flush.

Step#4

Using plate #3 Remove the inlay collar and set the cutting depth to 1/4 In. Be sure that the bit will not bottom out into the inly kit. <u>Do not pocket cut this piece it is an inlay piece</u>, so only cut the outside perimeter. Re-saw piece out 1/4 In. thick.

Step#5

Install the inlay collar. Setup positioning plates on your project piece, using plate #3 cut out a pocket slightly shallower than your inlay piece. Glue in inlay piece, Let dry and sand flush. For this step use sanding dust from the project wood not the inlay piece when filling cracks.

Step#6

Cut pockets marked #4. Glue in inlay pieces, let dry and sand flush.

Step#7

Cut pockets marked #5. Glue in inlay pieces, let dry and sand flush.
