### **Additional Instructions: DAISY**

However this particular design does require some additional instructions besides the basics available in the above mentioned video...

1. When cutting out the all the inlay pieces in this design except the center circle (plate 3) , use a thicker piece of wood and then re-saw the thickness of the cutouts down to 1/8” thick. This will help you avoid the cutout piece breaking loose from the tape and damaging your piece during cutout. This is the standard procedure we recommend for cutting out all small pieces.
2. This set includes a timesaver plate. Use it to help keep all of the cutouts in the same grain direction and to allow you to cut all the like pieces out without having to re-tape down your pocket stencils for every cutout.
3. This is a rotational design. When creating the pockets, use the plates in numerical order, but be sure to rotate the plate for all pockets before moving to the next plate. There is an arrow on every side that should be on the “top” during each pocket cutout.
