Instructions: Texas Star

Additional Instructions:

- 1. The Texas star is a rotational design. This means that plate number 2-2 should be rotated so all five sides are flush on top to complete.
- 2. The points of the star can be done as a single color by simply following the general directions, to achieve the two tone look of the display you will need to do a glue up of two contrasting woods. It is recommended that you use ¼ in or thicker wood and re-saw to the desired thickness on a band saw or table saw.
- 3. When doing the 6" design, cutting the pocket for plate 1-2 you may have to use an oversized base plate on your router or use the four plates (included in your kit) witch fit inside the circle. Simply cut around the outside as normal then insert the plates two at a time working across the

- pattern to remove the entire pocket. Do not apply tape inside the circle to avoid wood chips from sticking to it during the process, causing you inserts to not seat properly.
- 4. For best results we have found that when setting up your positioning plates to cut your pockets, it is better to create a square corner with a flat surface on top and side. If you try to create the octagon shape with them it is more difficult to set them accurately.
